PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Was on a walk at 5 pm and he vomited once after. Then he became Wobbly, was unable to stand and urinated himself. High possibility of Marijuana ingestion.
 Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Wobbliness, mild tense abdomen. Blood work show mild increase in ALT. Others are WNL. Normal CPL. Urine drug test, positive for Marijuana.

SPECIES

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

Golden Retriever

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The right coxofemoral joint presents moderate osteophyte new bone formation. The right acetabular groove is shallow, and the center of the femoral heads is lateral to the dorsal acetabular rim.

SEX

Male Neutered

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

AGE

5 Years

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.
