PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Presented for acute onset of swelling of P3 on the right forefoot. O noted the P was sensitive on the foot yesterday and the following grooming today, they noted significant swelling of the digit. Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Moderate to severe erythema and inflammation of P3 of the right forefoot Nail bed erythema noted on most toes

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE FRONT PAWS

Radiographs of the right front paw in orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

Miniature Poodle

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The third digit of the right front limb presents a moderate circumferential homogeneous soft tissue swelling. The osseous structures of the right front paw – including the third digit – are within normal limits.

The left front paw is within normal limits.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**AGE**

- Soft tissue swelling third phalanx right front paw without evidence of osseous involvement
- Normal left front paw

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The most likely differential for the soft tissue swelling of the third digit is inflammatory infectious origin (e.g. onychitis, foreign body). Check for any cracking of the nail as point of entry for infectious agents. Ultrasound might be considered to rule out migrating foreign body.
