



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Kiwi Savoca History of eating plastic and bedding. Defecation has decreased to once a day, stool is produced. No vomiting, appetite normal.

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

Havanese

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

SEX

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

MN

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

AGE

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

8 Months

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and contains gas and fluid.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

INVOICE

The radiographic study is negative for radiopaque foreign material throughout the gastrointestinal tract. There are no signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Recommend re-evaluating the patient if clinical signs such as vomiting develop.
