**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Pt has a history of intermittent constipation; we are checking for any physical cause.  
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Normal labwork.

**COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY OF THE ABDOMEN**

A high resolution plain CT study of the abdomen is provided for review.

**COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The serosal fat presents normal attenuation behavior. There is no evidence of peritoneal effusion or peritonitis.

**SEX**

MN

Both kidneys present within normal limits for size, shape and organ architecture. After contrast administration a bilaterally symmetric and uniform nephro- and pyelogram is noted.

**AGE**

8 Years

The adrenal glands are within normal limits for size, shape and organ architecture.

Both liver and spleen present with normal shape, even surface, uniformly attenuating parenchyma.

The pancreas is evenly contoured, the pancreatic parenchyma is homogeneous.

The position, delineation, wall and content of the gastrointestinal tract are considered within normal limits throughout.

The vertebral endplates L6/L7 and L7/S1 present moderate spondylosis formation.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The CT study presents without abnormalities, explaining the intermittent constipation. The most frequent comorbidities are chronic kidney disease or obesity, however a multifactorial pathomechanism for recurrent constipation is considered and a primary cause may not be found in many cases. Rule out pain originating from the lumbar spine as source for the clinical signs as well.
