Bobby Batko History: history of URT infection in February. Resistant bacteria were found in bacterial culture - was treated. Same issue occurred again this November - culture came back with different bacteria. R/O lower respiratory tract infection vs others

Feline Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: loud upper respiratory noise. BW WNL

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

BREED

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

Himalayan

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

SEX

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

Neutered Male

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

AGE

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

16 Months

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected. The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.
