**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Vomiting after eating for the past few days and diarrhea 2 days ago. Cat ate dinner last night without vomiting. NPO today. Eating and drinking fine. Urinating fine. No blood in the stool or emesis.

**SPECIES**

Feline

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Creat 3.5, BUN 32, SDMA pending, ALT 207, GGT 5, ALP < 10, T. bili 0.8, T4 pending, UA pending. Abdominal ultrasound report pending.

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

**SEX**

Female Spayed

A wet fur artefact is seen level with the ventral abdomen.

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

**AGE**

3 Years, 6 Months

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and contains a small amount of formed fecal material.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Normal abdomen

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**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study is negative for pathology. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. A complete abdominal ultrasound examination has already been performed for further definition.
