PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

- Reduced appetite for the past few days
- Not as interested in play
- Indoor cat
- One episode of vomition about 4 days ago

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: CBC shows marked neutropenia <1000 SNAP retroviral negative abdominal rads done to make sure no concerning changes fro peritonitis, i don't appreciate anything concerning, but wanted to run it by a radiologist.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Radiographs of the abdomen in three image planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Normal abdomen

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study reveals no abnormalities of the abdominal structures. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction.
