PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

coughing on and off, tonsil biopsy of tonsil showed a reactive tonsil. Skull/throat rads were normal, C3/C4 degenerative changes on previous submission. on and off starts to vomit/regurgitate. (exaggerated swallowing was given sucrilate) weight loss

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN

A complete set of radiographs of the thorax and abdomen is provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Thorax

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

MN

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

AGE

7 Years

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

HOSPITAL NAME

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.

Abdomen

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

INVOICE

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space. Multiple small, roundish mineralized bodies are superimposed on the cranioventral abdominal peritoneal fat.

DATE

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

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Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

SPECIES

Canine

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

BREED

Shepard Cross

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Suspect nodular fat necrosis falciform fat versus dystrophic subcutaneous mineralization, otherwise normal abdomen
- Structural normal thorax

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study of the thorax and abdomen presents without clinically relevant pathology.

AGE

7 Years

Complementing workup by an abdominal ultrasound examination will allow further assessment of the abdominal organs.

INTERPRETED BY

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If there is suspicion for dysphagia, a fluoroscopic swallowing study can be used as advanced diagnostic imaging modality.
