PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Pet is completely not using the front left leg. Pet's heartworm and tick panel is negative. Pet is not responding to vetprofen. Eating and drinking is normal.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Geriatric profile is within normal limits.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE SHOULDER JOINTS

Radiographs of the shoulder joints in a mediolateral projection are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Both shoulder joints present smooth osseous margins and the surrounding soft tissue structures are within normal limits.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Normal shoulder joints

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study of the shoulder joints presents without abnormalities, explaining the described clinical signs – there is no evidence of an aggressive bone lesion. Rule out pain originating from the soft tissues (e.g. brachial plexus, bicipital tendon, neck) or distal aspects of the front limbs.
