



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Frannie Caruso Patient has been lethargic since yesterday. Had on episode of vomiting. No diarrhea. Patient has been coughing and wheezing since vomiting episode. Patient likes to play and chew on yarn, string, and hair ties.

SPECIES Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Abdominal discomfort on palpation, mild. Mild dehydration

Feline **RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review. Radiographs are provided in JPEG file format.

BREED RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Ragmuffin The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

Female The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

AGE The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

2 Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

INTERPRETED BY

The stomach is in its anticipated position and is empty, but a small amount of gas.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

HOSPITAL NAME The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

- Normal abdomen

REFERRING VET INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

Dr. Shah The radiographic study of the abdomen presents without abnormalities, explaining the described clinical signs. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Recommend complementing workup by complete blood work.

INVOICE If clinical signs are refractory to therapy, follow up radiographs or an abdominal ultrasound examination are recommend; in some cases a high ileus may lack classical radiographic signs of mechanical obstruction.
