PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Lame right front for 1 month. Painful palpation of right elbow.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ELBOW JOINTS

Radiographs of the elbow joints in two imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Both elbow joints present smooth osseous margins. The contour of the medial coronoid process of both elbow joints is well-defined. A sclerosis is seen at the base of the medial coronoid process of the left elbow joint. The surrounding soft tissue structures of both elbow joints are within normal limits.

SEX

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Mild sclerosis base of medial coronoid process left elbow joint
- Normal right elbow joint

AGE

6 Months

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The current radiographic study of the elbow joints presents without abnormalities of the right elbow joint. The mild sclerosis at the base of the coronoid process of the left elbow joint can indicate underlying coronoid disease. Consider a clinical trial with NSAID and rest. If clinical signs are refractory to therapy and due to the young age of the patient with ongoing mineralization of the medial coronoid process, I would recommend re-evaluating the elbow joints in 1-2 month.
