



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Billie Butt Vomiting bile and gagging last couple weeks, last few days has been gagging without production of anything (no bile/food). Examination under tongue, no string.

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Feline Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

Domestic Shorthair

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

SEX

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

Spayed Female

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

AGE

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

3 Years

The stomach is in its anticipated position and is empty and contains a small amount of gas.

INTERPRETED BY

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and generalized mildly distended by gas.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

REFERRING VET

The generalized mild gas distension of the small intestinal tract can be a sequela to the vomiting or indicate (gastro)enteritis. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. If clinical signs are refractory to therapy, recommend follow up radiographs or a complete abdominal ultrasound examination; in some cases a high ileus may lack classical radiographic signs of mechanical obstruction.
