Charlie Pardee History of bladder stones. Seen on 03/14/23 for hematuria. Sent home with clavamox. Picked up Gabapentin on 03/24/23. Hematuria cleared up for a few days then started over the last _ hours. O's finished antibiotics last night but feel that P may have been spitting out the tablets so are not sure if she has been taking consistently.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Bichon Mix

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

In the right lateral view, in the subcutaneous tissue dorsal to T5, a small gas inclusion is seen – suspect preceding subcutaneous injection.

SEX

Spayed

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

AGE

13

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

INTERPRETED BY

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.
