



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Dango Liao Tong 3 yr old Shiba Inu. started coughing about 1 month ago on the day owner picked her up from boarding. started doxy at 10mg/kg po sid x 10d. Pet's cough persisted and doxy was continued and pred added in. owner is finished with all meds. dog is still hacking/retching and has nasal discharge and nasal congestion. coughs readily on tracheal palpation. good energy/appetite, non febrile. today we submitted a baseline chem/cbc, Upper Resp PCR and chest rads to rule out primary pulmonary/cardiac disease. Today we sent pet home with Clavamox antibiotic.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

BREED

Radiographs of the thorax in two imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

Spayed Female

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

AGE

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

3 Years

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

INTERPRETED BY

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

HOSPITAL NAME

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.
