Lola Monaghan Diarrhea for a month, was prescribed Meloxicam by another vet a month ago
 Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: cPLI 324 (0-125), BUN, creatinine- moderately elevated, ALP- mildly elevated

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

Chihuahua No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.
 The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

SEX The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

Female Spayed The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

AGE Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and contains a small amount of gas.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

REFERRING VET The radiographic study presents no abnormalities, explaining the history of chronic diarrhea. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Regarding the laboratory changes, the presumptive diagnosis is pancreatitis. Rule out other potential such as parasitic infection, dysbacteriosis, dietary indiscretion, inflammatory bowel disease, other.
