**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN**

A complete set of radiographs of the thorax and abdomen is provided for review.

**BREED**

Mixed

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

Thorax

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

**SEX**

Male

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The vertebral heart score is 10.0. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

**AGE**

13 Years

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

**HOSPITAL NAME**

The lung parenchyma is hypoinflated in the lateral views, accentuating a generalized moderate unstructured interstitial lung pattern; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.

Abdomen

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

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The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

**DATE**

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary



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bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract. The prostate is occupying approximately 50% of the height of the cranial pelvic inlet – considered normal for an intact male dog.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study of the thorax and abdomen presents without pathology. No abnormality is appreciated, explaining the cough. However, negative radiographs do not rule out tracheitis or bronchitis entirely.
