PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Vomiting since Sat. night vomited all of dinner owner describes as projectile vomit. Vomiting shortly after eating sometimes and not vomiting if owner feeds bread and seems to hold down water. Has had a odd cough last month every once in awhile. Not eating his food as fast as usual for last week. Diarrhea yesterday, normal stools today

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX & ABDOMEN

BREED

German Shorthair Pointer

A complete set of radiographs of the thorax and abdomen is provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Thorax

SEX

Neutered

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

AGE

11 Years, 6 Months

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.

Abdomen

The vertebral endplates along the cranial lumbar spine present moderate spondylosis formation. The intervertebral disc space T13/L1 is mildly narrowed.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

SPECIES

Canine

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

BREED

The stomach is in its anticipated position and empty.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

SEX

Neutered

- Spondylosis deformans cranial lumbar spine
- Suspect discopathy T13/L1
- Normal thorax

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

AGE

11 Years, 6 Months

The radiographic study presents without clinically relevant abnormalities. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. If not done so yet, complementing blood work by cpl is beneficial. If clinical signs are refractory to therapy, recommend a complete abdominal ultrasound examination.
