



**PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Oreo Campbell Indoor cat. Vomiting and diarrhea started 4 days ago. Last vomit was two days ago No BM today. Was not eating in the last 3-4 days, ate very small amount earlier today. Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Blood work indicate mild dehydration, mild increase in ALT and Total Bilirubin, otherwise unremarkable.

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Radiographs of the abdomen in two imaging planes are provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

**SEX**

Female Spayed

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

**AGE**

21 Months

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and empty.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and the transverse segment contains a small amount of unformed fecal material

- Structural normal abdomen

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**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study of the abdomen presents without abnormalities explaining the described clinical signs. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. Consider complementing workup by a complete abdominal ultrasound examination to rule out intramural changes (e.g. inflammatory, neoplastic).
