



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Otacon Zeiser P eats indiscriminately and did eat some wood on 3/25. P has been vomiting, once a day and mainly undigested food, bile and there was some wood in at least one episode of vomiting. Defecation seems normal. O said that P ate breakfast at 6:30am today and rads taken 1:30pm today. PE: wnl

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Radiographs of the abdomen in two imaging planes is provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

Labradoodle No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin. The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

SEX The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

NM The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

AGE Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

REFERRING VET The ingesta in the stomach >6h post feeding can still be a normal finding, depending on the quality of the fed diet, but might indicate delayed gastric emptying – e.g. due to gastritis, pancreatitis. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction.
