Rocki Commisso Regurgitation, vomiting (bile and pieces of food), gagging, not eating,

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE NECK & ABDOMEN

SPECIES A lateral projection of the neck and the abdomen are provided for review. Radiographs are provided in JPEG file format.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED Neck

Welsh Terrier The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

A small amount of gas is seen within the esophagus.

SEX The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

MN Abdomen

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

AGE No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

6 Years The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

INTERPRETED BY The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

Sebastian Schaub, DVM The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

Dr. med. vet. DipECVDI

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.
