PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History of inappropriate urination/defecation. Have used compounded Prozac. Recently defecating outside litter box, owner thinks has trouble passing stool. Has renal disease, doing well on renal diet. Physical exam, possible mass/swelling mid abdomen. Rectally stool is normal.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The intervertebral disc space L7/S1 is moderately narrowed and the respective vertebral endplates present mild spondylosis formation.

SEX

MN

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

AGE

14 Years

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small to moderate amount of gas and chymus is seen throughout the small intestinal loops.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.
