PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

History: 3y/o intact male german shepherd, was found with detached digital pads on both front limbs after being missing from 5 PM to 10 PM the previous night. O says P was hit by a car but suspects injury due to running on hot pavement or abrasive surfaces. No vocalization or pain response to palpation of limbs except discomfort when weight bearing.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: HBC yesterday Otitis externa AU Superficial dermatitis - most likely yeast infection Skin slough off from large pads on both front paws. Lichenification and hyperpigmentation on armpits and groin area. Grade 1/5 LF lameness

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE LEFT FRONT PAW

Radiographs of the left front paw in two orthogonal image planes.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The osseous and surrounding soft tissue structures of the left front paw reveal no abnormalities.
