History: Reason for Visit: LIMPING RR History: PET IS HERE FOR LIMPING ON RR LEGS. OWNER STATES NOTED LAST NIGHT. TODAY IS PUTTING LIGHT WEIGHT ON. LAST NIGHT PET DIDNT WANT TO EAT, BUT TODAY DID EAT. OWNER STATES PET HAS BEEN ONLY WANTING TO EATING 1/2 SERVING SIZE AS USUAL (ON GOING BEFORE LIMPING)

SPECIES

Canine Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Hydration: Appropriately hydrated Mentation: BAR EENT: No nasal discharge; nuclear sclerosis OU; clean no exudate AU; No cough on tracheal palpation. Oral Cavity: moderate dental tartar present, gingivitis Lymph Nodes: Symmetrical, no changes in size, shape, consistency Skin: Good hair coat, no signs of ectoparasites. Multiple (~5) small pink lobulated dermal growths. CV/Respiratory: No murmur or crackles/wheezing auscultated.

BREED

Yorkie Synchronous pulses, normal rate. Normal bronchovesicular sounds. Abd/GI: Soft non painful abdomen, no organomegaly, no abnormalities on abdominal palpation Uro/Perineum: N Musculoskeletal: Ambulatory x4, WB lame on RH. Pain on palpation of RH thigh musculature. Grade 3-4 MPL RH. BCS 6/9 Neurological: Appropriate

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE RIGHT STIFLE JOINT

Radiographs of the right stifle joint in two orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

The right stifle joint presents smooth osseous margins. A mild intracapsular swelling of the right stifle joint is appreciated.

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

No specific abnormality is appreciated, explaining the right hind limb lameness but evidence of mild joint effusion – might be a sequela to the clinically appreciated medial patellar luxation. Rule out acute on chronic disease/traumatic insult for acute onset of clinical signs. A clinical trial with rest and NSAID might be considered in first instance and reevaluating the patient if clinical signs are refractory to therapy.
