Anya Starkist Williams 2 y/o n,m dmh presents for coughing on and off for 6 months. O says that it has been more frequent for the last 2 weeks. O has not seen any mucous, says it sounds like a dry cough. P occasionally goes outdoors, and has some exposure to other cats.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

NM

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement.

The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

AGE

2 Years, 9 Months

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

Accentuated in the ventral aspects of the lung, thickening of the bronchial walls is appreciated. Generalized thickening of the bronchial walls is appreciated.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.

- Ventrally accentuated bronchial lung pattern

The ventral distribution of the bronchial pattern is increasing the odds for infectious bronchitis – bacterial, viral, (parasitic). However, feline bronchial disease is still a potential depending on success of treatment for supposed infectious bronchitis.
