Juliet Santomieri Juliet is a 14m/o spayed female Coton De Tulear that has a history of ingesting a plastic eyepatch yesterday. As per the owner's statements: She has been wheezing and was not eating and drinking. No history of vomiting. On exam BAR HP Chest clear NSF on examination

SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Canine Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Coton De Tulear The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.
No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.
The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

SEX The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

Spayed Female The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

AGE Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

INTERPRETED BY The stomach is in its anticipated position and empty.

Dr. med. vet. DipECVDI The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.
