PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

O had recently observed more subdued behavior -sleeping/hiding more, appetite/water consumption/litter box changes seemed consistent per O. Recurrent chin acne most recently potentially exacerbated by a diet change-O has since gone back to original diet.

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: cbc, chemistry screen, lytes OK, u/a shoed hematuria/cystitis/increased epithelial cells with no signs cancer on cytologic review via idexx

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

SEX

MN

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

AGE

10 Years

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity.

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.
