**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

P IS AN 11YR OLD F/S POMERANIAND PRESENTING TODAY FOR POSS REVERSE SNEEZE. O STATES 2 DAYS AGO INCREASE IN FREQUENCY AND O FEELS P SOUNDS CONGESTED. ALSO "SNORING" NOISES WHILE AWAKE. P COUGHING MORE THAN NORMAL AND PANTING AT HOME.

**SPECIES**

Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: CV/Respiratory: No murmur or crackles/wheezing auscultated. Synchronous pulses, normal rate. Normal bronchovesicular sounds. Referred upper airway noise

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX**

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

**SEX**

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

**AGE**

11 Years

The cranial mediastinum presents the expected soft tissue opacity. The mediastinal width is less than twice the width of the vertebral column at the same level.

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The diaphragm is well delineated with even surface and the expected mild cranial bulging of the diaphragmatic cupola.
