



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Orsen Crooker History: 4 day history of extending neck abnormally while eating; licking air and furniture; eating large amounts of grass and vomiting it up. No change in appetite or energy, No vomiting of food/water; no diarrhea, cough, sneeze, gag.

SPECIES

Canine Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Positional Intermittent slightly raspy breathing during radiograph (lying lateral and tech had an arm underneath p neck causing head/neck to be elevated)

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE NECK

BREED

Australian Cattle Dog Two radiographs in a lateral view are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

SEX

The intervertebral disc space C4/C5 is mildly narrowed.

Neutered Male

The mild prominent soft tissue opacity dorsal to the larynx is considered as the cranial esophageal sphincter.

AGE

4 Years

The pharynx is aerated and unremarkable. Physiological mineralization of the cricoid cartilage is appreciated.

The remainder of the osseous and soft tissue structures of the neck are within normal limits.

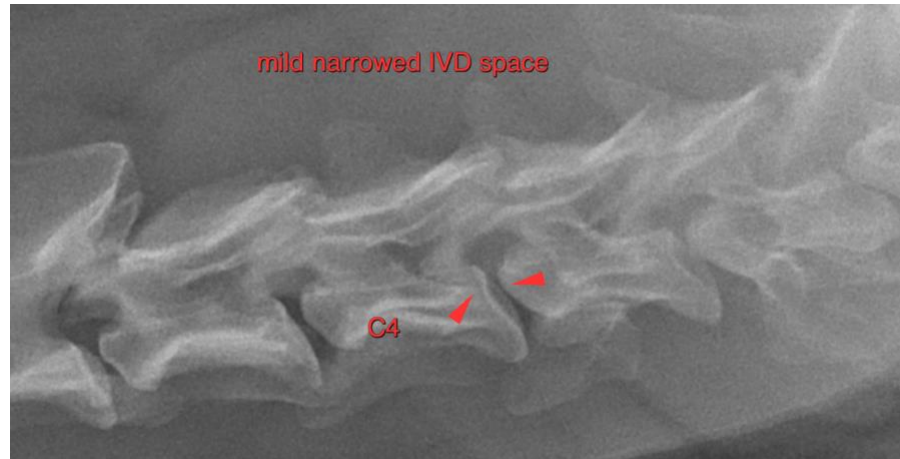
