PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Presented for eyelid mass removal. Hx of severe reactivity in clinic and moderate reactivity/hyperactivity at home. 1 year ago was noted on exam to be very reactive (vocalized, tried to bite) on palpation of caudal abdomen and stifles. Has not had a thorough hands on exam of limbs since then as reactivity has progressed. During sedated exam noted bilateral hip and shoulder abnormalities. Shoulders 'clunk' / have crepitus on ROM. Hips have reduced abduction and extension and notable clicking on abduction. Stifles/elbows and distal limb NSF. Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: NSF on CBC/CHEM.

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE SHOULDER JOINTS AND PELVIS

Radiographs of the shoulder joints in two imaging planes and the pelvis in a VD projection are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Both shoulder joints present smooth osseous margins and no abnormalities of the surrounding soft tissue structures are appreciated.

The osseous and surrounding soft tissue structures of the pelvis are within normal limits. Both coxofemoral joints present smooth osseous margins and congruent joint spaces.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Structural normal shoulder joints
- Structural normal pelvis

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The radiographic study of the shoulder and coxofemoral joints presents without abnormalities of the respective joints. There is no evidence of OCD lesion or degenerative joint disease. Anyway, check clinically for instability of the shoulder joints or increased laxity of the coxofemoral joints as source for the appreciated clinical findings.
