Saga Affolter Rule out esophageal mass by larynx

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE NECK

SPECIES Radiographs of the neck in two orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

Canine **RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

The vertebral endplates C2/C3 present mild spondylosis formation.

BREED The larynx has the expected anatomy. No alterations of the tracheal course and shape are appreciated.

Border Collie A small gas depot is seen in the most oral segment of the esophagus, accentuating the cranial esophageal sphincter, dorsal to the larynx.
