**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

Pet has intermittent lameness of the right forelimb after exercise for the past 2 months. Last week, pet was non weight bearing for a couple days but improved with rest. Pet has a housemate that they collide frequently in the doorway when heading outside, this pet will hit his right shoulder frequently on doorjam. Pet also has a history of panosteitis in the right radius and ulna in April 2019 as a 1 year old (diagnosis via radiology interpretation). On physical exam today, no lameness detected and palpation and manipulation of both forelimbs and range of motion including neck appeared normal. Pet at times will stand with the RF toes slightly out or lateral with elbow tucked in towards chest. Previous films from 2019 are included as well.

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE SHOULDER & ELBOW JOINTS**

A complete set of radiographs of the shoulder and elbow joints is provided for review.

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

Both shoulder joints present smooth osseous margins and the surrounding soft tissue structures are within normal limits.

The elbow joints are within normal limits.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Normal shoulder & elbow joints

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The radiographic study of the shoulder and elbow joints presents without abnormalities.

In case of strong clinical suspicion for pathology of the bicipital tendon or rotator cuff injury, workup can be complemented by an ultrasound examination of the shoulder joint.
