RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE LEFT HIND PAW

Radiographs of the left hind paw in two orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The second phalanx of the left hind paw presents a moderate circumferential, homogeneous soft tissue swelling.

The osseous structures of the left hind paw are within normal limits.

The soft tissue swelling of the second phalanx of the left hind limb is not specific and potentials include trauma or inflammation. There is no evidence of osseous involvement.
