High pitched bark suddenly and eating less. Losing weight-2kg in 2 months. Snores now. On exam larynx palpates as enlarged, hard and circular
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: ALT very mild elevation in Nov, otherwise labwork done then was normal

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE CERVICAL SPINE

Radiographs of the cervical spine in two orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The pharynx and larynx are aerated and present with normal position and anatomy.
The osseous and surrounding soft tissue structures of the neck are within normal limits.
The pictured parts of one shoulder joint presents moderate osteophyte new bone formation.

- Normal neck
