**PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS**

acting wired , not eating , shaking , can not walk straight , tail is down  
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: moderate abdominal distension , BW : hyperglycemia , rest is okay

**RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN**

Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.

**BREED**

Chihuahua

**RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS**

Eight lumbar vertebra are appreciated.

No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin.

**SEX**

Spayed

The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.

The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.

The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.

**AGE**

21 Months

Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.

The stomach is in its anticipated position and is mild to moderately distended by gas.

The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.

The colon is seen in the expected position and contains a small amount of unformed fecal material.

**RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS**

- Overall empty gastrointestinal tract
- Small amount of unformed fecal material in colon
- Lumbosacral transitional vertebra

**INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS**

The overall empty gastrointestinal tract can be a sequela to hyporexia or gastroenteritis. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. No additional clinically relevant abnormalities are appreciated.
