Cully Kammer acute onset pain per O, yelping, looking at back end and sitting quickly.
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Exam: pain when l-s is flexed (scooping him up to pick up) mild discomfort when extended. CP intact. Anal glands are non painful and easy to express, prostate non palpable pending cbc chem ua

RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE LUMBAR SPINE & PELVIS

Radiographs of the lumbar spine and the pelvis in two orthogonal imaging planes are provided for review.

BREED

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

Sacralization of L7 is appreciated, presenting bilaterally symmetric shortened transverse processes. The sacrum consists only of two vertebra.

SEX

The osseous and surrounding soft tissue structures of the pelvis are within normal limits. Both coxofemoral joints present smooth osseous margins and congruent joint spaces.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

AGE

- Symmetric lumbosacral transitional vertebra (Type II) with sacralization of L7
- Normal pelvis and coxofemoral joints

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

An underlying cause for the described clinical signs cannot be specified, but the lumbosacral transitional vertebra can predispose for lumbosacral degenerative stenosis.
