SPECIES RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE RIGHT CARPAL JOINT

Canine A dorsoventral projection of the right carpal joint is provided for review.

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

BREED Centered on the right antebrachiocarpal joint, a homogeneous soft tissue swelling is appreciated – accentuated at the medial aspect. The intermedioradial carpal bone presents a small geographic osteolytic lesion of the subchondral bone in the distal aspect.

RADIOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- SEX**
- Articular swelling right antebrachiocarpal joint
 - Suspect prominent synovial fossa distal aspect right intermedioradial carpal bone

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

AGE The soft tissue swelling of the right carpal joint can be traumatic, degenerative, or inflammatory (infectious versus immune mediated) in origin; the odds for neoplastic disease are low as there are no signs of aggressive bone lesions. If not done so yet, complementing workup by a synovial tap is mandatory for further workup.
