PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Reason for Visit: limping R front paw History: 2yr 1m old NM toy poodle "Busya" presented for front paw weakness. Yesterday evening Os noticed P has been slightly less active, limping on R front paw. P is usually very active, playful, and vocal - hasn't been since yesterday. P has been wanting to sleep more - O has video of P limpin on paw. P is e/d fine otherwise, no v/d reported. No previous injury to paw and no significant event that O can think of to contribute to this injury. Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: Physical Examination Key -- (N= Normal, A= Abnormal) Hydration: Appropriately hydrated Mentation: BAR, bit my finger, otherwise did OK for exam EENT: No nasal discharge; clear no discharge OU; clean no debris AU; No cough on tracheal palpation. Oral Cavity: mild dental tartar present Lymph Nodes: Symmetrical, no changes in size, shape, consistency Skin: Good hair coat, no signs of ectoparasites. Mild erythem R inguinal area. CV/Respiratory: No murmur or crackles/wheezing auscultated. Normal bronchovesicular sounds. Abd/GI: Soft non painful abdomen, no organomegaly, no abnormalities on abdominal palpation Uro/Perineum: N Musculoskeletal: Ambulatory x4, lame on RF. Pain on palpation of RF paw digit 5 +/- on extension of R elbow. BCS 6/9 Neurological: Appropriate
