Enzo Claudio Medina	Patient presented for two vomiting episodes with mild amount of blood and liquid diarrheas without blood one week in duration. Patient has been eating less than half of its normal daily diet quantity. Patient was lethargic the day vomiting and diarrhea episodes started, then patient went back to normal attitude. Patient used to eat table food, for various months. Patient has not been seen eating household items. Patient is up to date in vaccination and heartworm/flea/tick prevention. Diet is purina proplan 1 cup twice daily

BREED	Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: CBC and CHEM: within normal limits radiographs: distended loops of bowel.

SEX	RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE ABDOMEN
Neutered Male	Radiographs of the abdomen in three imaging planes are provided for review.
AGE	RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS
3 Years	Eight lumbar vertebrae are appreciated. The vertebral endplates of the lumbosacral junction present mild spondylosis formation.
	No abnormalities of the extraabdominal soft tissues are noted. The abdominal wall is smooth and thin. The serosal detail is maintained throughout the peritoneal and retroperitoneal space.
	The liver is appropriate in position, size and presents uniform opacity.
INTERPRETED BY	The splenic head is in the anticipated position and within normal limits for size and opacity. The splenic body and tail are considered normal for position, size, shape and opacity.
Sebastian Schaub, DVM Dr. med. vet. DipECVDI	Both kidneys are seen and present with normal size, shape, delineation and opacity. The urinary bladder is in its anticipated position. No radiopaque calculi are noted throughout the upper and lower urinary tract.
HOSPITAL NAME	The stomach is in its anticipated position and presents normal content.
Alejandrino AH	The small intestinal loops are of even diameter and non-dilated, a small amount of gas is seen within the small intestinal loops and considered within normal limits.
REFERRING VET	The colon is seen in the expected position and presents with appropriate content.

DATE	INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS
8/8/23	The radiographic study presents without abnormalities, explaining the history of vomiting. There is no evidence of radiopaque foreign material, abnormal gas pattern or signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction. If clinical signs are refractory to therapy, recommend follow up radiographs



PATIENT or a complete abdominal ultrasound examination; in some cases a high ileus may lack classical radiographic signs of mechanical obstruction.
