PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

chronic vomiting and now inappetance / suspect pyloric stenosis
Abnormal PE/Chem/CBC/UA Results: elevated ALT

COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHY OF THE ABDOMEN

A high resolution pre- and post-contrast CT abdomen is provided for review.

BREED

Bichon Frise

COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

The serosal fat presents normal attenuation behavior. There is no evidence of peritoneal effusion or peritonitis.

SEX

Male

Both kidneys present within normal limits for size, shape and organ architecture. After contrast administration a bilaterally symmetric and uniform nephro- and pyelogram is noted.

The adrenal glands are within normal limits for size, shape and organ architecture.

AGE

1 Year, 5 Months

Both liver and spleen present with normal shape, even surface, uniformly attenuating parenchyma and homogeneous contrast enhancement, unremarkable.

The pancreas is evenly contoured, the pancreatic parenchyma is homogeneous and presents uniform contrast enhancement.

The position, delineation, wall and content of the gastrointestinal tract are considered within normal limits throughout. The stomach contains a mild amount of fluid. The pylorus presents a physiological wall thickness, measuring 4.5 mm.

The bony and surrounding soft tissue structures reveal no abnormalities.

COMPUTED TOMOGRAPHIC DIAGNOSIS

- Structural normal abdomen, no signs for gastrointestinal mechanical obstruction
- No evidence of pyloric hypertrophy

INTERPRETATION OF THE FINDINGS & FURTHER RECOMMENDATIONS

The current CT study of the abdomen presents without abnormalities. However, a negative CT study does not rule out functional disorder or pyloric stricture. A positive contrast study of the stomach (15 ml/kg contrast) -either radiographs or dynamic fluoroscopic study can be used to evaluate pyloric function. Rule out food intolerance or gastritis as well.
