



PATIENT PRESENTING CLINICAL SIGNS

Dexter Gisewhite Patient presented 9/16/22 for coughing fits. Owner stated they only seem to happen after patient plays rough with his brother. Brother is a littermate to patient and is currently normal. Owner stated coughing fits started approximately 6 months ago and happen daily (3-4 times a day). Owner hasn't taken notice to color during these events at home, in-clinic during exam patient was cyanotic, wheezing heard in the lungs, no murmur noted.

DSH **RADIOGRAPHIC STUDY OF THE THORAX**

Radiographs of the thorax in three imaging planes are provided for review.

SEX

RADIOGRAPHIC FINDINGS

MN

The surrounding bony structures are within normal limits.

The extrathoracic soft tissues present homogeneous without abnormalities.

AGE

The heart is of normal size and shape, there is no evidence of cardiac chamber or vascular enlargement. The pulmonary vasculature is within normal limits.

2 Years

The trachea is normal in diameter and presents the anticipated course. The luminal outline of the trachea is smooth.

The bronchial tree presents with thin walls and tapers uniformly towards the periphery as expected.

The lung parenchyma presents the expected architecture and opacity; the intrapulmonary vascular branching is seen up to the third order lung vessels.

The radiographic study of the thorax presents without overt abnormalities, explaining the presenting clinical signs. Given the clinically appreciated cyanosis, a cardiac echo might be considered to rule out congenital heart disease.
